CINDY MURRELL, CANDIDATE FOR VICE – PRESIDENT 2018-2020

Cindy Murrell is a native Las Crucen. She joined the League of Women Voters in 2016 and is currently a member of the Youth Engagement Committee. She retired from New Mexico State University in July 2017 after 29 years of teaching English literature and composition. In the past ten years she has contributed to improving the status of nontenure-track faculty at NMSU by working with others to write amendments to the



English Department By-Laws, the Faculty Senate Constitution, and the NMSU Policy Manual.
